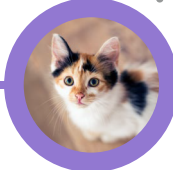

**BE A FOSTER PARENT**

**HELP THE NEW FAMILY**

Help mom care for kittens by providing food and shelter. If mom enjoys petting, bring them all in your home! If she does not, leave them where they are. If mom is unsocial, consider taking the kittens inside once they reach 5 weeks old. At 7 weeks of age, either find them homes on your own or bring them in to Toronto Humane Society for adoption!



**HOME & CARE**

**Younger Kittens:** Socialize at home. When ready, find them a home or bring them to Toronto Humane Society.

**Older Kittens:** It's difficult to socialize kittens after 3 months of age, and their welfare in a home may be poor. Consider trap-neuter-return.
