Mulan and her puppies were well taken care of and as soon as they're healthy enough, the puppies will receive their spay and neuter surgeries and find their forever homes.

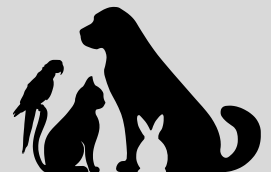
