Parvovirus Puppies


Lennon, Lynn and Lawrence, adorable 2-month-old mastiff puppies, were surrendered into our care because they were showing signs of Parvovirus.

Parvovirus is an extremely contagious disease and can be fatal if it is not treated.

After running some tests to confirm that they had Parvovirus, they were immediately given around the clock treatment with IV fluids, IV antibiotics, and close monitoring.

Thanks to the support from our medical team and onsite staff, these playful pups are making progress in their Parvovirus treatment.
