## Animals Admitted into the Urgent Foster Care Program

July was a ground-breaking month for the Urgent Foster Care program. The program received 83 inquiries and accepted 23 admissions. These are the highest amounts to date.

## Helping a Senior Cat Feel Comfortable

Noire\*, a senior cat, was very nervous when entering his temporary home with his foster parents. His foster parents were very patient with him as he slowly adjusted to a new environment.

While he kept his distance and continued to be independent in his foster home, he was well cared for until he was ready to reunite with his family.

They commented, "The Toronto Humane Society team and the foster family did a really good job. They took care of Noire when he was sick. Thank you for helping and taking care of my baby!"

## Keeping the Trio Together

Some may turn down necessary medical treatment because they're concerned about who will care for their pets while they are away and recovering– our Urgent Foster Care program can help.

Snickers\*, Skittles\*, and Skor\* entered the Urgent Care Program because their pet parent needed medical treatment. Because the trio of dogs were bonded, we placed them in the same foster home.

Their foster family sent updates every two weeks to their pet parent. Knowing, and seeing, that Snickers, Skittles, and Skor were well taken care of and loved made the medical treatment and recovery process much easier on the pet parent.

After 6 weeks apart, they were happily reunited with tons of kisses and wagging tails.
