Maude* spent all night at an emergency clinic with her dog, Angel*, because she was experiencing pregnancy pains. Sadly, she could no longer afford to provide Angel with the emergency surgery she required – so with a heavy heart she took Angel to Toronto Humane Society to surrender her.

Our intake department reached out to our Public Veterinary Services to see if we'd be able to accommodate the emergency surgery. Dr. Minter performed an exam and determined that an emergency spay would resolve the issue and keep Angel in her loving home.

The surgery was a success and Angel has been happy and healthy at home ever since.

This includes **\$8,858.54** worth of public subsidy that was provided during the months of January, February, and March.


Subsidy funding helps make essential veterinary care more affordable, which in turns helps more pet parents in our community care for their pets and keep more families together.

Dental Services

Wellness and Preventative Service Appointments Provided
