Helping a Pet Parent Receiving Medical Treatment

A pet parent needed medical care and was concerned that they wouldn't be able to care for their cat while receiving treatment, so they made the difficult decision to reach out to Toronto Humane Society to surrender their cat.

The Admissions and Rehoming team connected the pet parent and presented them with the alternative option of enrolling in the Urgent Care program.

The family cried tears of joy after hearing about the chance of getting their cat back after treatment was done. After a few short months, the cat was reunited with their family.
