

How to Find a Boarding Facility or Pet Sitter?

Where do I start?

If you google the term "boarding kennel near me" or "pet sitter near me," chances are you will come up with pages and pages of websites. You may find you are overwhelmed by the choices and will simply call the first ones on the list.

While convenient, this is not the best way to choose your service, as smart marketing, great SEO skills and a nice-looking website should not be the only criteria to drive your choice. It's important to know that pet sitting businesses, dog trainers and dog walkers are unregulated professions. This means that other than meeting commercial zoning or business permit requirements that individual municipalities impose, there are no governing or regulation bodies that oversee pet sitters, dog walkers, dog trainers or kennels. Some kennels and pet sitters obtain membership in national or international associations, or pursue certifications in their fields of interest, but these are voluntary, not mandated certifications and memberships.

However, association membership or certification generally indicates an adherence and commitment to a code of conduct and best practices. While not every great service provider seeks certification or association membership, it can be a good start in finding a truly educated and dedicated pet pro. Unfortunately, at the time of this writing, there is no Canadian pet boarding or pet kennel association so it can be difficult to find a comprehensive list of kennel or boarding services.

Here are a few associations to use as a starting point in your search if you are looking for a pet sitter or kennel operator who is affiliated with a larger association or has obtained certifications in specialty fields. Often, professionals certified in other areas of specialization provide boarding services.
