TNR Surgeries Provided

Our Trap Neuter Return (TNR) program, ensures that community cats are given support to improve their wellness so they can live whole and healthy lives. This service is provided free of charge to caretakers.

Giving Lifesaving Treatment to Mila

Mila's guardian, also a caseworker for clients served at our inner city outreach clinic, reached out to us in a challenging situation.

Struggling to afford an emergency surgery for her dog, Mila, who had a significant number of stones in her bladder that needed removal, the owner sought assistance. We facilitated Mila's life-saving surgery, ensuring it was performed at a cost that Mila's pet parent could manage, providing the necessary care for Mila during a critical time.

This includes \$29,327.37 worth of public subsidy that was provided during the months of October, November and December.

Subsidy funding helps make essential veterinary care more affordable, which in turns helps more pet parents in our community care for their pets and keep more families together.
