
Giving a Safe Space for a Dog to Heal

Following a severe accident resulting in extensive burns, a dog was enrolled in the Urgent Care program.

In a nurturing and secure home, the dog underwent continuous wound care until the family was joyfully reunited three weeks later.

Keeping a Dog and Cat Duo Together

Seeking a temporary home together, a cat and dog duo joined the Urgent Care program. A compassionate foster parent stepped forward to provide temporary care for both pets. The pair remained in the program for 5 months and were joyfully reunited with their family.

Helping a Pet Parent After Losing Their Job

After losing their job, a pet parent moved to Toronto in search of a better employment opportunity. Unfortunately, they couldn't secure a place in a petfriendly shelter and had to reside outside while waiting for access.

The pet parent shared a 5-year-bond with their pet and was reluctant to enter the Urgent Care program because they were worried they wouldn't be able to secure a job and be reunited. After speaking with staff members, the individual returned and accepted the offer to enroll in Urgent Care.

Although they did not have a personal cell phone, they consistently reached out for updated until they were accepted into a shelter that allowed them to bring their pet.
