Urgent Foster Care Program: Keeping Families Together During Difficult Times

Toronto Humane Society's Urgent Care program plays a vital role in keeping families together by providing temporary foster care for pet guardians facing short-term crises. This response-based, preventative initiative is designed to support individuals who are unable to care for their pets due to circumstances such as fleeing domestic violence, sudden housing instability or homelessness, or being admitted to a care facility for health treatment. By offering a safe haven for pets during these challenging times, the Urgent Care program ensures that families who have no other options do not have to face the added heartache of being separated from their beloved animals.

Stopping 8 Cats From Being Surrendered

In a remarkable demonstration of its commitment to keeping families together, Toronto Humane Society's Urgent Care program recently admitted two large bonded families of cats over the course of two days, totaling eight cats in a single day.

These cats were at risk of permanent surrender due to their families facing sudden crises that impacted their ability to provide care. By stepping in and offering temporary foster care, the Urgent Foster Care program prevented the heartbreaking separation of these cats from their families, underscoring the critical role it plays in supporting pet parents through difficult times.
